FROM THE
PASTOR

Unwrapping the Gift of Jesus Christ.

Epiphany, celebrated on January 6th, marks the day the Magi recognized Jesus' divine nature through their gifts. This season reminds us of the profound divine revelation of Christ to the world, inspiring awe and reverence in our hearts.

It begins with Jesus' birth, when God's glory shone around the shepherds, revealing His divine nature. The angels proclaimed, "...born this day in the city of David is a savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11). This divine revelation invites us to trust in Jesus' divine identity and love.

Jesus is made known to the Gentiles through the Magi, who come bearing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh—symbols of His kingship, divinity, and eventual sacrifice. These gifts remind us that Jesus is the King of the Jews, the divine Son of God, and the Savior who died at Calvary for the sins of the world.

John the Baptist testifies to Jesus' divine nature, calling Him the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29). When Jesus was baptized, the Spirit descended from heaven and rested on Him, affirming His divine identity. His baptism revealed Him as the true Messiah, God's Anointed One, and His purpose to take away the sin of the world is for you too, as you are baptized into Jesus and the Holy Spirit dwells within you.

Jesus begins his ministry and calls his disciples, an unlikely group of men who were uneducated in theology. They were not Rabbis or teachers. They were the blue-collar people of the day, working hard to eke out a living: men who were sinners, and even a tax collector.

Jesus goes forth into the crowds, proclaiming the gospel message and healing every disease. Jesus' great mercy and salvation lead us *"to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly"* with our God (Micah 6:8). Jesus is the righteous one of God, faithful in his teachings. He gives his people true righteousness as he justifies you by faith so that your prayers go up to God like incense. Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law. He continues to give you his mercy and love in all situations. Jesus is your most precious gift, your treasure, and your hope.

We are supporting Matt and Martha Miles, their group and their family as our Ministry of the Month for January. Please continue to remember them in your prayers as they reach out in California to those who are seeking Christ.

Here is part of a recent letter From Matt and Martha:

Dear Friends and Family,

Merry Christmas & Happy New Year 2026! We are so grateful for you and continue to remember you in our prayers! May this season be sweet as we celebrate the birth of Jesus!

We have been celebrating the big and small ways we see God at work in this season. I continue to visit young men that are incarcerated at the Juvenile Hall here in Modesto and each time I go I experience God's joy. I probably mention that everytime I share a story. A couple of weeks ago I led a Bible study on a passage from the Gospel of Matthew about forgiveness. Over the course of the study 5 young men filtered in and out of the group. One young man joined us a bit late, but came excited to engage with the passage. As the other young men each left to make their phone calls, he stayed and began to tell me his story. He told me that he had been on the run in a stolen car with some friends. While driving in a high speed chase from the police, he heard a voice tell him to pull over. He thought one of his friends was talking to him. 'No!', they said. 'Keep driving! We didn't say anything!' He kept driving, but again heard the voice say 'Pull over.' He decided to listen to the voice and pull over. He was arrested and sent to Juvenile Hall. While there, he heard the voice again, this time it told him to get a book. "The voice didn't say which book to get, but to just get a book", the young man told me. An orange book grabbed his attention and he heard the voice tell him to take that book. He took the book back to his cell and began to read it. The book turned out to be a Bible. 'As I was reading the Bible, I didn't hear the voice again, but the Bible was speaking to me. I began to realize that the voice I was hearing was God's voice and that I wasn't going crazy.' He looked around the room and pointed out to a handful of young men and told me that he had helped them start reading the Bible. He also told me that he was back in here because even though he had started following Jesus, he had acted as his old self. He confessed that he had an anger problem and had come in with the desire to fight a lot of the other young men, but had decided to make a truce with them instead. 'What's the point of fighting them? There is so much violence and I always believed that I would only live until 21. Now I am believing that I am going to live longer.' As we looked at the passage with the other young men, he quickly grasped how Jesus is not putting a limit on forgiveness, but is asking us to forgive so that we too can be in right relationship with God. He also brought up how important it is for us to forgive ourselves. As I was finishing up, a young man who lost the privilege of coming out for Bible study was banging on his door to get my attention. 'Are those Bibles you are carrying?', he asked me. 'Yes', I said. 'Can I have one? I have a New Testament, but I really want to read the whole Bible. 'Of course,' I told him. Over the last month, I have been able to give about 10 young men Bibles of their own. The hunger for God continues to astonish me and fill me with joy.

Martha and I have been building a stronger relationship with Youth for Christ, the organization we are partnering with. This week we had the leader of the Juvenile Hall and after care ministry over for a meal and we talked more about how we could partner together. We felt really encouraged by his invitation to be a part of team (continued on page 6)



he is putting together in the new year to rethink the aftercare program and how to better serve the young people we are ministering to in Juvenile Hall.

I (Matt) have also begun to prayerwalk different neighborhoods each week with some other men and I was able to invite this leader to join us and cast vision about our desire to prayerwalk around the Juvenile Hall and the neighborhoods the young men & women we are meeting are coming from.

This advent in Modesto has been very dark. I (Martha) can count on my hand the sunny days we have had. Most days there are dark clouds that look like rain but there has been almost no rain. When the sun breaks through it feels like a warm hug and it lifts our spirits! The spiritual atmosphere has felt similar. I have had so many women sharing stories of horrific domestic violence and abuse. It felt so dark and our hearts were breaking. Women were dealing with possible homelessness, food shortages, money shortages for basic necessities and just feeling hopeless. Some are still in that place. The light and miracle is that as they reach out to God he is answering impossible prayers. He is providing through so many people, churches and organizations. One landed 2 jobs, another got housing and is budgeting, another is taking steps toward freedom. God is reminding us that He sees their tears and is moved by their cries, he always responds in his perfect way and timing. Emmanuel means God with us. It is the song that has kept coming to mind this advent. There are so many people, myself included, who are living as captives to something or someone. The idolatry, adultery, fear, violence, hopelessness, hate, poverty, greed, unforgiveness, pride, deception, mistrust and injustice are rampant in our world. We need the songs of longing and lament. We are desperate for Emmanuel God with us. He is the light that has broken into our dark world as a babe and he will come again as the King of Kings! That is our hope, Yeshua, Messiah, the Prince of Peace, the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Wonderful Counselor, the great I AM! Thank you Lord Jesus Christ for coming to save us. Thank you for setting captives free when you triumphed over sin and death by taking our punishment and place on the cross! You rose from the grave and showed us that you are the only way, the truth and the life. You alone deserve our worship and allegiance. There is no one like you! Reign in our hearts and in this dark world! You are the Light that conquers darkness! You are the lover of our souls who pursues us! You are the word made flesh who dwells with us and in us. Thank you Lord and Savior! We magnify you Jesus!

"O come, O come Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lowly exile here, until the Son of God appear. Rejoice, rejoice, Emmanuel. Shall come to thee oh Israel."

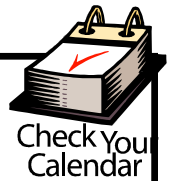
